- Develop relationships with community partners, research current trends, and prepare lesson plans with effective and measurable objectives to create innovative year-round therapeutic recreational programming.
- Collaborate with parents, teachers, and school districts to facilitate, implement, and evaluate well-organized and successful camp experiences.
- Assess participants' specific needs and create individualized behavior plans to help each participant succeed in each program.
- Orient, train, mentor, and evaluate camp staff and volunteers. Assist with training, supporting, and monitoring seasonal staff performance through specific program oversight. Secure and monitor contracted specialty instructors as needed.
- Input specific program details into the registration system to help with seasonal brochure development and participant enrollment.

- Prepare program-specific budgets for the manager's approval and keep records of all expenditures within set budget limits.
- As needed in programs, fill the head instructor, assistant, driver, or inclusion staff role by executing established lesson plans, encouraging participant engagement, and ensuring participant safety.
- Monitor after-hours/weekend phone and respond to on-call situations as needed.
